So, I am sitting on this hillside in central PA, thinking about all the things I mentioned in the opening paragraph, asking the Lord to show how we might affect this crazy world situation for His Kingdom...and He says, "Look around!" God reminded me of the several hundred young people, compressed together in this "small" camp setting, sharing fellowship, and healthy competition around the precious Word of God. I "pondered anew, what the Almighty can do," through this group of students and their coaches in the years to come, by His Word. This is the real world as it was meant to be.
